We will use the Families First Plus team's offer of Early Help systems and procedures to keep children safe. We will intervene as early as possible to prevent families and pupils reaching crisis point and the need for statutory intervention.

Bullying including cyber-bullying	We will listen to the voice of the child. Through our values we endeavour to ensure that children understand how to interact with others. We are proactive in dealing with any incidents of bullying and strive to have a culture within school where children feel like they can tell an adult if there is something worrying them. We respond to non-verbal communication such as anti-social behaviour. Gloucestershire Healthy Living and Learning Team (GHLL) provide alerts and resources which can be used to tackle the issue of bullying. Children in Y6 attend the cyber-café in SkillZone to develop their understanding of how to interact when online. We provide online safety briefings for parents (SWGfL) and online safety
	training for the children.

Preventative work through developing self- esteem, identity, law and order and considering the impact of violence on individuals and the community.
Mental Health	Through our Values for Life programme we promote respect, emotional literacy, resilience, perseverance, trust and compassion. The GHLL online pupil survey will alert us to potential worries or concerns that children might have. School will use the GHLL Pink Curriculum to address concerns. Our Family Support Worker supports vulnerable children and can signpost vulnerable adults to relevant services. Staff receive alerts from GSCG and GHLL and attend regular training

	through GHLL. Head Teacher has attended Mental Health First Aid 'Lite' training. We will refer to CYPS (Children and Young People's Service).
