Maths	Carry out a survey of your choice (such as, favourite flavour crisps, colour, colour of cars that pass your house in an hour) and record the results using tables, bar charts, pictograms, pie charts.	Photograph and label examples of different types of triangles you can find in real life - maybe go for a walk. Isosceles, equilateral, scalene triangles.	Look at the poem "The Twelve Days of Christmas". Work out: How many gifts are given by the true love in total? How many legs are mentioned in the poem in total? For both questions show how you have worked it out.
Creativity (art/design)	Draw portraits of members of your family. You could hold a gallery at home to show them off.	Create a portrait using collage - wool, fabric, string	Design and make a Christmas snow globe – you may have to research how to do this.
English	Write your own poem. Practice and perform it to: Friends and family; The class	Who invented the plane? Research and create a powerpoint/leaflet/report about what you have found out. Remember to use headings, subheadings, bullet points, diagrams.	Why do we celebrate Bonfire Night? Research Guy Fawkes and either: Write a diary from Guy Fawkes point of view; write a non-chronological report about Bonfire Night; or write a poem about Bonfire Night.
Topical	Great British Bake Off Spend time baking with your family. Find a recipe, follow it, bake it, eat it. Take photographs of your creation.	Paralympics Create a table showing the medals won by team GB. Research and create a powerpoint/leaflet about the games - you could research a selection of the gold medallists.	Create a piece of artwork, word search or quiz about one of the topics studied this term: Forces, cam systems, Roald Dahl, Christmas, Bonfire Night.
