Dear Parents.

As you are aware reading is a priority at school. The more children read, the more words that they begin to understand and can use every day. A growing bank of words is incredibly important to how children speak, understand the world and progress within reading and writing in school.

A child who reads for 20 minutes a night reads for 3,600 minutes in a school year.

A child who reads for 5 minutes a night reads for 900 minutes in a school year.

A child who reads for 1 minute a night reads for 180 minutes in a school year.

If you or your child do not have a library card, I have the forms in school that you can fill in. Also, children who visit the Library 8 times (and get their card stamped) will also receive a book prize from School.

Also, the Library is letting us choose many books for each class that we can read on a 2-3-week cycle. The children will be involved in choosing these books and it will allow them to access many exciting books that we do not have in School. As the children read the books we borrow from the library, we will encourage them to create a piece of writing, a book review or a picture about the book which will be displayed at the Library.
