Pupil Premium Report 2014-2015

The government introduced the Pupil Premium Grant in April 2011. This grant is additional to main school funding and is seen by the government as being the best way to address inequalities between children who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers by using the grant to support disadvantaged pupils.

At Littledean C of E Primary School we are committed to supporting **all** of our pupils. We do this by providing high quality teaching, supplemented by interventions to support vulnerable learners as and when required. The school Leadership Team and the Governing Body monitor the impact of all spending and interventions, including the Pupil Premium.
