## Operation Christmas Child – Shoe Box Appeal

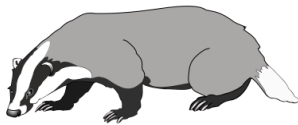

## House Points

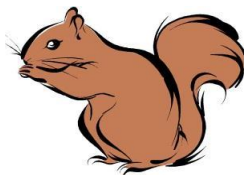
Each week our children work towards earning house points for their team. At the end of each seasonal term the house who have won the most times have an afternoon of fun.

House points are earned for a good attitude to learning, contributions to class discussions, good manners, ready to learn, growth mindset just to name a few.



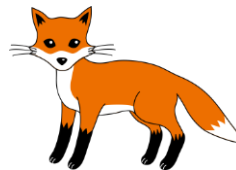

They were shocked that women weren't able to vote and were all pleased that Emily Pankhurst managed to change the law.



Next term Chestnut class will be looking at 'Who lives in Antarctica?' in geography, 'valuing difference' in PSHCE, 'electricity and circuits' in science, 'desktop publishing' in computing and 'How do festivals and family life show what matters to Jewish people?' in RE. We will be using the book 'Lights on Cotton Rock' to inspire our work in English and have already started reading the book 'Varjak Paw' by our new focus author S. F. Said.
