Holiday Requests

Please remember that the Government's guidance remains very clear that we cannot authorise holiday requests in term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. You may be issued with a penalty notice for taking your child out of school during term time. Please note that a penalty is issued to each parent for each child taken out of school. A Penalty Notice is a fine of £80 if paid within the first 21 days which increases to £160 if paid between 21 and 28 days. Thereafter, if the penalty remains unpaid this may lead to prosecution through the Magistrates' Court.

RE	What do Christians learn from the Creation narrative?


Maple Class

Maple Class have made a great start to Term 3. In Computing this week, we have continued learning about vector drawings, focusing on how to be effective and precise in our digital creations. Pupils have been developing their design skills and learning how to use tools thoughtfully to improve the quality of their work.



We have also begun our new class reader, *Wild Boy* by Rob Lloyd Jones. The story is set in Victorian London and follows a boy with an extraordinary power of observation and detection. When he is wrongly accused of murder, he is forced to go on the run, driven by hunger, hardship and a desperate search for the truth.

The novel explores themes of survival, friendship and injustice, capturing the children's interest right from the very start.



We are very excited about our upcoming visit to SkillZONE in Gloucester on Thursday 29th January. SkillZONE is a unique, life-sized interactive safety village run by Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue Service that helps children learn essential life skills in an engaging, hands-on way.

During the visit, pupils will explore a range of real-world scenarios — from road and rail safety to fire awareness, online safety and personal decision-making — all designed to help them recognise risks and make safer choices. The experience is highly interactive, with realistic environments such as a road crossing, a house, a train carriage and community spaces, bringing classroom learning to life in an exciting and memorable way.


I am absolutely delighted to introduce myself as the new teacher for Reception, Year 1, and Year 2. I am excited to embark on this learning journey with your children.
