FSW runs nurture group sessions for children with identified needs as mentioned above. FSW runs transition programmes for vulnerable children in Y6 to enable a smooth transition to year 6. FSW works with parents through My Plan+ work and liaises with other professional services.	Children are observed to be using strategies that they have been taught in order to deal with difficult situations. Attendance of vulnerable children is more stable and procedures in place to work with families to support this. Reports/feedback from agencies such as Social Care clearly indicates that the work carried out by FSW is of a high level and effective in terms of offering early intervention and support. Parents also report that FSW has had a positive impact on their family.
