

Remote Learning Offer 2020-2021

In September 2020 all of our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid-19 school closure in March 2020. We are remaining positive and hope that the whole school will resume full-time education as normal. However, we are also aware that there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or indeed the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time and likewise if there should be a local, regional or national school closure. As a result of this possibility we have set out a clear remote learning plan should any of these scenarios arise. This will help to ensure that all children can continue with their education.

We acknowledge that some households have limited access to devices and would require paper copies of work and we are happy to accommodate

What will 'remote learning' look like at Littledean C of E Primary School?

This information is to be used as a general guide to the school's current remote learning offer. We will send additional information and updates as and when it is required.

We aim to send home learning activities from your child's second day of absence. There are two general scenarios outlined below; the first is where your child is not permitted to attend school due to having to isolate or having to stay off school whilst waiting for a test or test results. The second outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble not being permitted to attend school for a period of time or a local, regional or national school closure.

In the event of any form of isolation/closure and loss of learning caused by Covid-19, parents must understand that engagement in home learning is essential. It is the school's responsibility to ensure that learning provision is available and accessible to all. We do appreciate that if children are ill, they should not be expected to engage in home learning. It is the parent's responsibility to enable their child to engage in online learning as fully as possible.
