




ART - What do you see when you look at your face in the mirror?

Key Vocabulary	
Line	Can take many forms: horizontal, diagonal, vertical, curved.
Tone	The lightness or darkness of something. This could be a shade or how dark or light a colour appears.
Texture	The way something feels or looks like it feels.
Shape	An area enclosed by a line. It could be just an outline, or it could be shaded in.
Pattern	A design that is created by repeating lines, shapes, tones or colours.
Colour	Primary colours = red, yellow and blue. Secondary colours are made by mixing any two primary colours.

Facial Proportions




Frida Kahlo

Born: 6th July 1907. Died: 13th July 1954

Born in Mexico

When Frida was six, she had an illness called polio, which left her with a damaged right leg. She had to wear a special brace to support her leg and to help her to walk. When she was 18, she had a terrible bus accident, which left her with lots of injuries, including broken bones in her spine, collarbone, ribs, pelvis, leg, foot and shoulder. Once again, she had to rest and spent three months in a full body cast to help her to recover.

Frida included lots of bright colours in her self-portraits, reminding us of the vibrant colours of the hot country where she lived. She also included lots of tropical flowers and animals such as monkeys and beautiful birds.



Pablo Picasso

Born: 25th October 1881. Died: 8th April 1973

Born in Malaga, Spain. Died in Mougins, France.

Picasso was married twice and had four children. He liked to draw from an early age. Legend has it that his first word was "piz", short for "pencil" in Spanish. He didn't want to paint like people hundreds of years ago. He wanted to create something new. Picasso worked in many different styles. In 1907 Picasso began to experiment with a new style of painting called Cubism. In Cubism the subjects are analysed and broken up into different sections. Then the sections are put back together and painted from different perspectives and angles. He often used sand or plaster in his work to create texture. He produced over 1,800 paintings and 1,200 sculptures.

David Hockney

Born: 1937 in Bradford, England. Hockney is still alive.

Hockney has worked with many different types of media - oil paint, acrylic paint, computer art and photography.

For this unit of work, we will focus on his use of photography. He accidentally created a new technique of collaging photos resulting in new art, which he called 'joiners' - a photomontage. Initially, he used Polaroid pictures, and then used other forms of technology, like laser faxed images and photocopies. Hockney is a great admirer of the work by Cubist artist, Picasso, and the collages create a cubist effect.

Despite Hockney being in his eightieth year, he continues to create works of art and exhibit in galleries around the world.
