Outdoor Learning	How many different sports can you experience in one week? In a month? Photograph yourself trying different activities and date them.		Go for a walk with your family ~ how many different types of trees did you see? Can you name them? You could photograph your walk, collect leaves from the trees and use the internet to identify the type of tree it is.		Take a walk to Littledean War Memorial – record the names of people who died in World War I and/or II ~ can you find out any information about these people – maybe ask older members of the community; look on the internet – you may need your parents help with this.
Topic	Science: What makes an insect an insect or a mammal a mammal? Write a non-chronological report about a chosen animal classification(s). Draw and label the parts of the animal type.	History: Interview a family member about their school days, work, play, food, etc. How will you present this? Video? Written report? Powerpoint with pictures?	History: Research planes used during WWII. Draw or create a model of one or more of the planes. Photograph your creation and email to the class email address.	French: draw a picture of your family including pets. Label the different people and pets in French.	
Maths	Carry out a survey of your choice (such as, favourite flavour crisps, colour, colour of cars that pass your house in an hour) and record the results using tables, bar charts, pictograms, pie charts.		Practise reading, writing, ordering, comparing and naming the place value of: Year 5 = numbers up to 1,000,000 Year 6 = numbers up to 10,000,000 Cut out a selection of items from a catalogue (e.g. Argos) and/or print a few house prices from Zoopla and order the amounts. Can you read the amounts? Can you write the amounts in words? Can you compare them using <> symbols?		Do you know all times tables up to 12x12? Play online games to improve your speed: www.topmarks.co.uk Create a game which practices your times tables, e.g. pairs, guess my number (like guess who)... Play the game with your family – take photographs of you playing the game. If you want to practice your calculation skills, visit www.myminimaths.co.uk and complete age appropriate maths revision – if in year 5, please do not complete year 6 tasks.
Creativity (art/design)	Draw portraits of members of your family. You could hold a gallery at home to show them off.		Create a portrait using collage – wool, fabric, string...
