Art:	Kandinsky - create Kandinsky's Concentric Circles using nature.	Sketch planes used in World War II - name them.	Research World War II medals - create a close observational drawing of them.	
History:	Interview a family member about their school days, work, play, food, etc. How will you present this? Video? Written report? Powerpoint with pictures?	Our history topic is World War II - make your own evacuation suitcase. You could literally make a suitcase out of cardboard and make models of the things you'd pack or you could draw your suitcase or write a non-chronological report about what you'd pack and why or create a powerpoint. What five things would you take with you and why? It's the thinking behind this task that is the real learning.		
Outdoor:	Try a sport you've never tried before.	Build a den - is it waterproof?	Play outside - enjoy the sun!	Go swimming. How many lengths can you swim in 10 minutes?
Project:	Design and make a new lolly. What flavour will it be? How will you make it? Write a set of instructions.	Allow others to taste your lolly - create graphs showing those that like/dislike the flavour. From the results, will you change the ingredients?	Create an advertisement for your lolly. Possible ways of presenting this: record a TV advert; record a radio advert; design a poster. Remember adverts are supposed to persuade people.	
Trip:	Visit a local place of interest - Gloucester City museum; Gloucester Folk museum; National Waterways museum; Dean Heritage Centre; Sculpture Trail.
