You should have received an email regarding the governing board of Littledean Church of England School formally seeking views on plans to join the Diocese Gloucester Academies Trust (DGAT), an Academy Trust.

The proposed change means that the school will formally join a larger family of schools and will be under the direct legal governance of DGAT. The change means that Littledean Church of England School will no longer be responsible for its own governance.

#### **Clothing in School**

As the weather is starting to grow colder and wetter we ask that children bring in a warm waterproof coat in to school each day. We try to go outside for break times and lunch times even if it is a little bit cold and wet.

Also most of our PE sessions will be held outside, we suggest children wear tracksuit bottoms, gloves and hats for their PE sessions.

We ask that the children taking part in Forest Schools bring a change of socks and if they like to get really muddy during the sessions a spare pair of trousers that they can change into.

Although we have a small amount of spare clothes for our infant children we are always looking for donations of pants, socks, trousers, tops for when they have those small accidents. If your child comes home in spare clothes we ask that it is washed and returned as soon as possible.

### **Holiday Requests**

Please remember that the Governments guidance remains very clear that we cannot authorise holiday requests in term time unless there are exceptional circumstance. A Request for Leave of Absence form can be found on the school website at the following link or from the school office:

You may be issued with a penalty notice for taking your child out of school during term time. Please note that a penalty is issued to <u>each</u> parent for <u>each</u> child taken out of school. A Penalty Notice is a fine of £80 if paid within the first 21 days which increases to £160 if paid between 21 and 28 days. Thereafter, if the penalty remains unpaid this may lead to prosecution through the Magistrates' Court.

#### **Maple Class**

Maple Class have settled back into school well after the half-term break. This term, we're continuing with our class reader, Black Powder, and hope to finish it in the next couple of weeks. After that, we'll be diving into our new book, The Snow Sister — we can't wait to get started!





In English, we'll be focusing on writing stories and newspaper reports. We're looking forward to using some of the techniques we explored in our poetry unit — like personification and similes — along with some new ones we're learning and refining this term, such as "show, don't tell," adverbial phrases, and a variety of sentence openers. With all these skills coming together, we're hoping to produce some amazing stories.

Over the next few weeks in Maths, we'll be strengthening our skills in short and long multiplication and division before moving on to Miss May's favourite topic — fractions!

#### Maple Class Get a Taste of Spain!

This year, KS2 have begun learning Spanish and are working incredibly hard to master the basics of greetings such as *hola*, *adiós* and *¿cómo estás?* 

Today, Maple Class took their learning a step further by making and eating some traditional Spanish dishes. On the menu were **Moorish Lamb Meatballs** (*Albóndigas de cordero morunas*) and **Spanish Garlic Prawns** (*Gambas al ajillo*).
