We hope you are all enjoying the children's return to school. We are very pleased that they are back and ready to learn.

Your help to minimise the Covid-19 risks are much appreciated. Please continue with our new drop and collect timings, detailed below, and the wearing of masks. We appreciate it is lovely to meet and chat to other parents at drop and collect times but please remember we are operating a 'drop and go' / 'pick-up and go' policy and ask that parents do not gather to chat in the playground or in Oak Way car park. ## Illness / Absence from School

If your child is unwell before the start of the school day, please do not bring them into school. Please phone the school office and let a member of staff know exactly what symptoms your child is exhibiting, even if you do not suspect Covid-19.

If your child becomes ill during the school day, we will ask to you come and pick them up as soon as possible. We will request that you access a Covid-19 test and follow the government guidance [‘stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus \(COVID-19\) infection’](#).

The most important symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of any of the following:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness. However, if you have any of the symptoms above you must stay at home and arrange to have a test to see if you have COVID-19. ## School Meals

Caterlink continue to provide us with packed lunches rather than hot meals at present. We hope that this can change in the near future.

Week commencing Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2021 the packed lunches will consist of a wrap rather than a baguette. Please let us know if this will cause any issues.

As from Monday 19<sup>th</sup> April, the price of a meal will increase to £2.34 per day, £11.70 per week for those that wish to pay for a lunchtime meal.

## Free School Meals – Holiday Activities and Food Programme

We have been given the following information regarding the Holiday Activities and Food Programme. If you would like to apply for the cookery sessions please do so this weekend.

*Due to the current restrictions imposed by the government, the Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF) will be delivered virtually for the Easter half-term period. During the **first week of half-term**, we will provide educational activities to all Free School Meal children. These will include cook-along videos and tasks for them to engage with. All activities will be suitable for children aged 5 to 16. They will be available on the HAF web page which can be accessed through the Gloucestershire County Council website.*

*Families will also be able to collect a Home Cooking Kit which contains recipe cards and enough food/ingredients for 4 meals and an Activities Pack with things to do for that week.*

*These will be available for pick up from a collection point in their local area. Parents will be required to complete an application form in order for us to allocate and distribute the Home Cooking Kits/Activity Packs.*

*In addition, families will receive the Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers to cover the **second week** of the Easter half-term. Please note this provision is for children aged between **5 – 16 only**.*

*If Families received the Holiday Vouchers previously, then they will not need to re-apply for the vouchers for future holiday periods. However, all families will need to apply separately for the Home Cooking Kits/ Activity Packs to enable us to distribute accurate numbers.*

*If the families have not received Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers previously, then they will need to apply using our online portal which will go live nearer the Easter half-term. We will keep you updated and notify all schools when this is live.*

### Asymptomatic testing information for parents and adults in households with children at school or college

Following the announcement by NHS Test and Trace all adults in households with school and college age children without symptoms can now access regular rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. Test kits can either be collected or ordered online. As a School we are not able to give test kits to parents, carers or household members. Secondary school and college students will continue to access testing through their school or college.

Undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing helps reduce transmission of the virus. Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles. Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are different ways for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- through your employer, if they offer testing to employees
- by collecting a home test kit from a local test site – anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests
- by ordering a home test kit online – please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most

If you have any queries about the tests, and you live in England, please call 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day from 7am to 11pm.

Children of primary school age (and below) without symptoms are not being asked to take a test.

Testing is voluntary, but strongly recommended to all who are eligible. Alongside the vaccine, washing hands, wearing face coverings, and maintaining social distancing, rapid testing plays a vital role in reducing transmission rates. Getting into the habit of regular testing as part of our everyday lives will help us all to play our part and do what we can to protect each other
