It would benefit your child if they could practise their spellings at home as well as in school. Not only does it improve reading and spelling, but by practising these words, it also improves letter formation and muscle memory. The more a child practises spellings, the quicker they learn to read the word and the quicker muscle memory improves. As muscle memory improves, the spelling of words becomes more natural.
