Please continue to support us by voting in store with your blue tokens and encouraging Friends and Family to do the same.



Also a reminder to parents and children – please do not play with the equipment in Holly Leaves outside area before or after school. Thank you.


Monday 5th May – School Closed


Reminder – School is closed on Monday 5th May 2025 for the Bank Holiday. We return to school on Tuesday 6th May at 8.40 a.m.


Holly Berries Class

Literacy

We will be using the book How to Hide a Lion by Helen Stephens this half term. It will be the stimulus for the children having the opportinity to write recounts, character descriptions and a poem. The children have enjoyed listening to and exploring the story this week.

Computing

This term we will be using the ipads to create simple animation using Scratch Jr. The children will program suing simple blocks of code to make their sprite (character) move in different settings. They have made a great start to the new topic.



Geography

Are big questions is "What is the Weather like in the UK?" The children will be using atlases to locate the 4 countries in the UK as well as learning about the different seasons. We hope to do some field work around the school to support the learning in class.

A Penalty Notice is a fine of £80 if paid within the first 21 days which increases to £160 if paid between 21 and 28 days. Thereafter, if the penalty remains unpaid this may lead to prosecution through the Magistrates' Court.
